

Public Sector Enterprises

Definition

 Public Sector enterprises are autonomous or semi-autonomous bodies, Authorities, Trusts, Foundations, Funds, corporations and companies, established, owned and controlled by the state engaged in business or welfare activates in Pakistan

PUBLIC SECTOR COMPANIES (CORPORATE GOVERNANCE) RULES, 2013

• **Public Sector Company"** means a company, whether public or private, which is directly or indirectly controlled, beneficially owned or not less than fifty one percent of the voting securities or voting power of which are held by the Government or any instrumentality or agency of the Government or a statutory body, or in respect of which the Government or any instrumentality or agency of the Government or a statutory body, has otherwise power to elect, nominate or appoint majority of its directors, and includes a public sector association not for profit, licensed under section 42 of the Act.

Introduction

- 1. During the past decades, a number of State-Owned Enterprises (SOEs) were established including corporations, autonomous bodies, companies, authorities, funds and trusts to undertake functions which were not deemed to be the routine business of the Federal Government to be executed through its ministries and attached departments. These entities, in terms of their incorporation structure, are of several types i.e., (i) registered as companies with Securities and Exchange Commission of Pakistan, (ii) established through special enactments, and(iii) registered as trusts, funds and foundations. Moreover, with the passage of time and due to complexity of operations of these entities, several subsidiaries were incorporated thereby further expanding the size of SOEs portfolio. As of now, there are around 212 SOEs incorporated by the federal government including the subsidiaries, trusts, and funds.
- 2. Due to a number of administrative, management and policy issues, the financial position of various SOEs deteriorated over time resulting into significant fiscal burden for the federal government in addition to poor service delivery to the end-users.

History & Overview

• At Independence, Pakistan inherited 12 SOEs. This number rose by a bit in the 1950s and 1960s as some development authorities and corporations (e.g., PIDC and WAPDA) were established. Then an explosion in numbers took place in the 1970s with the nationalization of large scale industries, banks, insurance companies, and educational institutions. A process of reversal eventually began in the 1990s. Between 1991 and 2015 as many as 172 privatization transactions were completed. The process then slowed, leaving the government with 212 SOEs at present. These are divided as follows:

- 85 commercial SOEs,
- 83 subsidiaries of the commercial SOEs
- 44 Non-commercial SOEs (Section 42, not-for-profit entities as well as trusts, universities, training institutions and welfare funds)


